One of the places Canopy Life has seen vast growth the past year is within the

Homelife team. Homelife staff is made up of roles that care for everything at Canopy Life outside of academics — house parents, counselors, chefs, and more. Among other responsibilities, Homelife provides mentoring that prepares students for the future. Anyone that has worked with kids and teenagers knows the importance of helping them recognize their voices matter. The ability to advocate for oneself and others is paramount in the kind of leadership that will move Kenya forward in future generations.

In fall 2022, Homelife staff had the opportunity to support a sixth-grade student, Hope, in putting the skill of self-advocacy into practice. Hope struggles with a pre-existing eye problem for which she was prescribed spectacles at age seven. Unfortunately, a short time before holiday break, Hope's glasses broke. Hope let Homelife staff know, and her parents set up an appointment to take her to the eye doctor while she was home.

However, in the days approaching break, Hope was experiencing persistent eye pain. Known for being confident and self-aware, Hope pressed on the Homelife Director that, "My eyes are very sick," and insisted she didn't feel like the issue could wait until she was home on break. Her persistence led Canopy staff to take her to the optician as soon as they could. Test results showed that one of Hope's eyes was completely damaged beyond repair and in need of transplant, while the other needed urgent surgery to save it. If they had waited any longer, Hope could have lost sight in both her eyes.

In October, Hope had laser surgery to save her right eye. Her recovery was so smooth that she resumed school the following week. Hope's parents are in contact with the local hospital to know when she can be scheduled for the left eye transplant, since the operation is fully dependent on an eye donor becoming available.

Hope's ability to present her case boldly and persistently saved her sight. The rapport she had built with staff gave her a place to speak up about her personal needs. Without her sight, Hope's educational path would have been significantly altered. Her story reinforces that Canopy Life's Homelife team is doing work that makes a difference in the individual lives of its students, preparing them for wider impact in the future.



David is the talk of the village . . . in the best way!


Canopy Life is developing leaders who can bring change to their communities in Kenya.

Through ongoing counseling with Canopy high school students, our Homelife Director, Linah, was able to learn more about David (a Canopy Life student in grade 7) that attests to the beneficial changes happening in our students.

Linah says, "Each time I meet with our high schoolers, we go through highs and lows, and catch up on how their school break went. At my last visit with them at the beginning of this term, Grace (a Canopy Life high school student) mentioned that her highlight was the change she has witnessed in David, who lives in her community. Other students who also attended this specific high school in the Karogoto community began telling me that David, a Canopy Life middle school student, is being recognized in the village due to the changes people have seen in him! They attribute the positive changes they see in him as God working through Canopy Life to help change his life for the better."

The students reported that he is more confident in who he is. He can easily maintain conversations and eye contact with people, which he couldn't do before joining Canopy Life. They also mentioned his cleanliness, responsibility, and trustworthiness. Villagers can confidently ask him for help when needed and he will help to the best of his ability. He has also become very active in his Sunday school.

Of course, we are able to see the wonderful change in our students, but are encouraged that others can see the changes as well! This is a small glimpse into a much bigger vision . . . One day, our students will bring change to their communities and help end the cycle of poverty.
